Concurrently, they are supporting the 1710<sup>th</sup> Transportation Company’s mobilization this month and our other units scheduled to mobilize this year. In partnership with the State Board, we will offer Soldiers the opportunity to register to vote at SRP and assist commander’s efforts for them to submit for absentee ballots after they mobilize. ## Volunteer Highlight



Each month, Family Programs will spotlight a Family Readiness Group Volunteer. This month we would like to introduce you to Mrs. Lori Wentworth.

Lori, a native of New York, is married to Major Phillip Wentworth. She and her husband have been married for seventeen years and have three children, Megan, Abigail and Elias. Lori is a full time first grade teacher and a dedicated Family Readiness Group Volunteer. She began volunteering in 1997 when her husband was a company commander. Her involvement at that time was minimal, as there was not a lot of emphasis placed on FRGs. When her husband deployed to Bosnia in 2001, she became more involved including being a key caller for the unit's phone tree.

Between 2001 and 2004, she remained involved in the FRG and helped where her talents were needed. In 2005, she shifted her efforts from company level FRG to battalion level FRG when she became the FRG Leader for the 1-116<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion. Lori distinguished herself through her exceptional performance in this role from December 2005 to February 2008. Lori assisted with helping families prepare for deployments that would send 1-116<sup>th</sup> soldiers to Kosovo, Kuwait and Iraq, all supporting different missions. This truly

## Army Microsoft Home Use Program

The Microsoft (MS) Home Use Program allows individuals to get a licensed copy of Microsoft Office desktop applications to install and use on a home computer.

The Microsoft Home Use Program (HUP) is eligible to all Army personnel. This includes, Active Duty, Reserve, Guard, and Civilians currently employed by the Army. Contractors ARE NOT eligible.

Note: you must logon to the ASCP using your CAC. You may experience delays as the site is very busy! Lots of Guardsmen are using it. You can get the latest versions of the Microsoft Office Suite as well as the operating system. There is a minimal fee for shipping and handling:

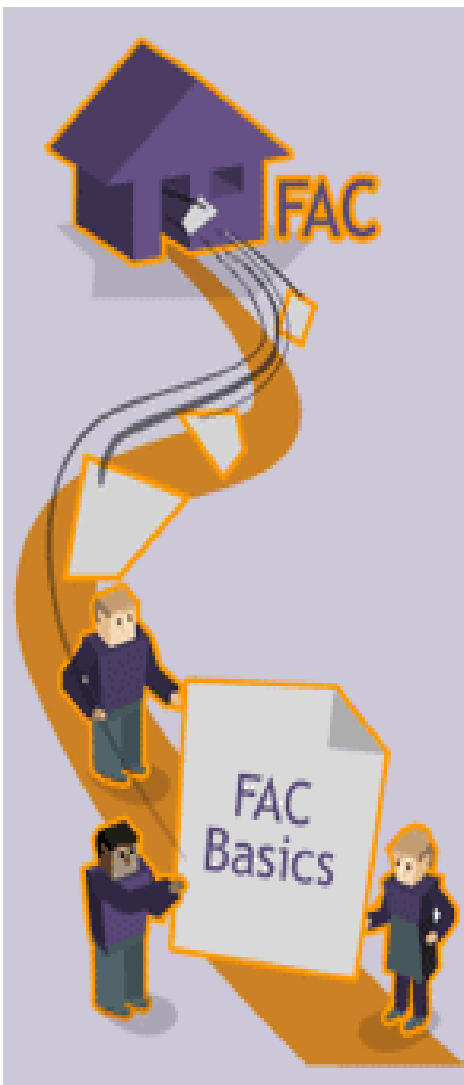

# *Family Assistance Centers*

Family Assistance Centers (FAC) were originally established to provide assistance and support to soldiers and their families at times of contingency call-up, mobilization and large scale deployment. However over the past years the FACs have branched out to assist any and all military members and their families during times of need regardless of deployment status or branch affiliation. Each FAC is staffed with a professionally trained FAC Specialist who is dedicated to providing assistance to service members and their families. Each of Virginia's FAC specialists has the added first hand experience of what it means to be either a military service member or member of a military family.

The FACs are considered one-stop shopping for those who need services and support. Through partnerships with agencies such as Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), The American Legion, The Red Cross and other local and national organizations and working closely with military personnel such as chaplains, commanders, JAG officers and family readiness group leaders, the FAC specialists are able to provide the very best assistance possible. Some of the areas in which a FAC specialist can provide assistance includes but is not limited to; TRICARE, DEERS, ID cards, financial and legal assistance, service and family member employment/re-employment and crisis intervention referral.

Family Assistance Centers are located through out the state. FAC specialists are available to soldiers and family members experiencing a crisis or emergency no matter when it may occur.
